Important Date- 13th Feburary

On 13 February 2008, Prime Minister Kevin Rudd made a formal apology to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, particularly to the Stolen Generations. This year marks the 16th anniversay of this apology.

The Apology Anniversary

A day to celebrate the Australian Parliament's Apology to the Indigenous Peoples of Australia, and in particular to the Stolen Generations, as a positive step toward reconciliation and healing. "It is very important that our children learn about
the history of Stolen Generations and the terrible impacts
such practices had on Aboriginal peoples' lives.
The Anniversary of the Apology and Sorry Day are
days that are critical in the journey of healing for Stolen
Generations and should be recognised in school events.
I believe that this resource will assist teachers to teach in
a positive and age-appropriate way a subject area which
requires a high degree of sensitivity."

Embedding Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives is a shared responsibility of approved providers, educators, and other professionals working in childhood educational settings. We believe that the history and culture of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples need to be respectfully and truthfully reflected, and by running activities that coincide with significant dates, we are able to teach some of this to children in an age-appropriate manner.

Activity:


'Track Home Feet' symbolises the quest of the Stolen Generations to find their way home, and the ongoing search by Indigenous families for their stolen children. It also symbolises the track towards the 54 recommendations that were made in the 'Bringing Them Home' report, which was a National Inquiry into the Separation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children from Their Families, published in 1997.

We will be doing a version of this footwork art as an activity on Tuesday. We will print out some plain footprints and the children will be able to decorate them.

Activity: Bat and Crocodile dreamtime story
