Message from the Principal

Dear BEPS families,

I can't believe we are at the end of Term 2! What a huge term it has been. Thank you to everyone who has made me feel so welcome over that time. I have gotten to know at least most of the wonderful faces at BEPS and love walking around the yard seeing all the smiles and Taylor Swift t-shirts (as well as the Chickens of BEPS)

Thank you to all of our teachers who have stayed late over 3 nights to run 3-way conferences. There was an average booking of 1.42 bookings per household! (Siblings and Curiosita increase our numbers) which is an amazing turn out from families. This tells me just how much you all value your children's education.

Last week we held our camp information session which was well attended. The expression of interest (due back today) and the PowerPoint was also emailed to families afterwards. Staff also went through this with students so I am confident everyone is really well informed!

The production preparation continues, with rehearsals, costume fittings and prop making. Please note that due to production there will be no Gatherings for the first 4 weeks. Friday Markets will also trial a fortnightly setting in an effort to reduce stress on families.

You may have heard the announcement that Phonics will be taught across P-2 in 2025 in all schools. We also will be implementing the Maths 2.0 curriculum from next term and the English 2.0 curriculum from the beginning of 2025. The first day back of term is a curriculum day for the staff to continue their

professional learning on Maths 2.0 as well as learning around the BEPS instructional model.

Finally, a reminder that today is the last day of term. Monday 15th July is a Curriculum Day.



Resource Smart Schools is a program offered by Sustainability Victoria that supports Victorian schools to embed sustainability across their facilities community and curriculum, while saving resources and money. Here at BEPS we are learning and practicing ways to integrate sustainability.

We are currently working on our Resource Smart Core module. In Term 3 we will conduct a Biodiversity audit and work on creating a 4 year Environmental management plan for the school. Great work everyone. Here are some ideas to help everyone become more sustainable at home.





7 Ways to make your home more sustainable

- 1. Create a compost bin of kitchen scraps.
- 2. Plant locally native species. You can have a garden that works with your climate without compromising on style by using resilient indigenous plants.

SCHOOL COUNCIL NEWS

The BEPS School Council had its final meeting for Term 2 on Tuesday, June 18th. It has been a busy and productive term for the School Council. Here are some of the key things the School Council, together with the subcommittees, have been working on:

Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP)

We discussed the ongoing valued work of the RAP subcommittee in advancing the development and endorsement of the school's RAP. It was agreed that all School Council members should undertake Culturally Responsive Training as part of the school's RAP. The School Council is also exploring the possibility of creating a community member position to provide First Nations people with a seat on the School Council.

Fundraising and Community Building

The Fundraising and Community Building subcommittee held an information session to encourage involvement in the Twilight Market on Monday, June 17th. It was great to see a positive turnout from both new and longstanding parents. Preparations for the upcoming production are also underway, including the T-shirt fundraising initiative.

Out of School Hours Care (OSHC)

The OSHC subcommittee is currently reviewing and updating various policies.

Building and Grounds

The Building and Grounds subcommittee is busy preparing a submission for the Victoria School Building Authority (VSBA) Capital Works Grant, focusing on redeveloping the 'Colourfuls' playground. Fingers crossed, everyone! Other grant applications in progress include the Healthy Harold and Bakers Delight Grant for the kitchen garden. Unfortunately, we were unsuccessful in our recent Victoria Schools Garden Program grant application, although we did receive a \$250 gardening voucher which can be used to fund some planting at the next working bee. We can try our luck again next year! The school is also in the process of initiating cleanup efforts along the Nicholson Street frontage, with Nelson Alexander generously agreeing to donate an enrolment/school promotional board in addition to the board they already provided for the Twilight Market.

The School Council expresses its thanks to all those in the subcommittees and school community for their hard work and contributions.

The next School Council meeting will be on Tuesday, August 20th.
