

### 2025 TIMETABLE CHANGE

This fortnights update for changes in 2025 is changes to the timetable. Sharing this information allows you to have conversations with children to prepare them for next year and gives them time to process the changes.

There are a number of reasons for a change to the timetable. A number of students struggle with such a short first break and such a long second break, so we have slightly adjusted them. We are ensuring requirements in our workplace agreement around break times and teaching times are met. Finally, the changes to the timetable enable us to structure our specialist program effectively. It also means students can engage in a solid 2-hour literacy block.

#### **SWPBS** @ BEPS

#### What is SWPBS?

SWPBS, or School Wide Positive Behaviour Support is an evidence based, DET approved school improvement approach that creates a positive and supportive learning environment for all students. It focuses on teaching and reinforcing positive behaviours while providing targeted assistance to students who may need extra support, leading to a more successful and inclusive learning community. When implemented well, it ensures that all students receive support to maximise behavioural, wellbeing and academic growth.

#### The BEPS SWPBS Implementation Process So Far

In 2023, the school identified the need to implement SWPBS to ensure we have a multi-tier, inclusive system to support student behaviour.

In Term 1 of 2024 a causal inquiry was then completed, and the data confirmed that BEPS lacked consistent behavioural expectations, which was impacting student and staff well-being, safety, and resilience.

During Term 1, a Tier 1 SWPBS Team was formed, and all members completed a 9-module introduction to SWPBS course. Our Mental Health & Wellbeing Leader (MHWL) also completed an SWPBS Team Leadership course.

Throughout Terms 2 and 3, the whole staff was introduced to the SWPBS framework, and we began working on the first three essential features of SWPBS: The creation of a Common Philosophy and Purpose, Leadership support, and Clarifying Expectations.

As a whole staff, and with parent and student input we created new schoolwide Non-Learning Community Behavioural Expectations and Learning Community Behavioural and Procedural Expectations.

All of the Non-LC SWPBS documents can be seen on the SWPBS bulletin board in the main admin building. The documents will also be shared with families via Seesaw or email.

This Term, all Learning Communities will begin explicitly teaching our non-LC and LC Behaviour and Procedural Expectations and introduce and use our new logical consequences for all minor behaviours.

We will discuss and improve our behaviour data tracking system on Compass, to include both major and minor behaviours.

We will also introduce a BEPS Acknowledgement System to acknowledge good behaviour.

By the end of 2024, it is hoped that all current staff and students will have a good understanding of SWPBS, our new expectations and logical consequences. Work on the program will continue into 2025.
