We had some requests by children to including nail polish/nail painting in our end of term activities (ie. to go along with face painting, coloured hair spray, temporary tattoos). Nail Polish Usage at BEPS OSHC- Permission Slip

Dear Families,

We had had some children request over this past year for activities involving nail polish (ie. nail painting). For some reference, at the end of term, we often run special (less frequently occurring) activities involving face paint, coloured hairspray and temporary tattoos. The children really enjoy these activities and have since requested if we can offer nail painting as well.

We are aware of health and safety issues and will be running the activity with full educator supervision; for example, school aged-children are old enough to no longer be sucking on thumbs (ie. risk of ingesting), older children can assist younger children, and activity will be conducted outside to prevent fumes, etc.

We try to, as frequently and as best as we can, accommodate to children's' requests for activities, however we felt it best to communicate with families to ensure that we are acting in accordance with their wishes. We think that this is great idea to run with the children, as it's colourful, creative and allows for self-expression and agency. We would love to get as many children involved as we can, and would love to give *all* children the choice to participate.

Going forward, we will be running this activity, however only with the children who have signed permission slips from families/parents. If you would like to give your child the choice to participate in this activity, please fill out of the permission slip below and return it to one of our staff members.

Children Survey Results- World Children's Day


