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
Upcoming significant community dates

National Science Week



From Koori Education:

"National Science Week is Australia's annual celebration of science and technology and thousands of individuals – from students to scientists to chefs and musicians. National Science Week provides an opportunity to acknowledge the contributions of Australian scientists to the world of knowledge. It also aims to encourage an interest in science pursuits among the general public, and to encourage younger people to become fascinated by the world we live in. The school theme for National Science Week in 2024 is Species Survival – More than just sustainability. The theme aims to highlight the importance of science and innovation in ensuring the survival and thriving of different species in an ever-changing world."







We have planned for science activities every day next week, to incorporate the National Science Week theme!

- Monday 'Species Survival'
 - This is the theme of 2024 Science Week! We will be showing the children some educational videos about the contributions Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have made, and continue to make, to our culture and science, particularly in their conservation and care of native animals across thousands of years! We will also look at some of the Woiwurrung words for Native animals.

We will also be running general, science-based activities, to give the children an opportunity to participate in a range of differing activities.

- Tuesday Physics
 - We will be conducting a science experiment about making and flying helicopters.
- Wednesday Maths/Puzzles (more so STEM)
 - This will be a bit more of a chill activity, with Rubix Cube club! We will have the Rubix Cubes out for children to play with and have a few puzzles for children to complete.
- Thursday Chemistry
 - We will be making an OSHC favourite- Slime! Our lovely science club educator Faye will be making edible slime with the children!
- Friday Baking (chemistry)
 - Lastly, we will be doing a bit of cooking science! We always have small groups on Fridays, so we will be doing some baking! Maybe a sweet treat like freshly baked chocolate chip cookies for all the children to enjoy!

Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP)



We have some really exciting news!!! For some time now, we have been working in partnership with BEPS, on our Reconciliation Action Plan. A Reconciliation Action Plan or RAP" is a formal commitment to reconciliation. It documents how your school or early learning service will strengthen relationships, respect and opportunities in the classroom, around the school/service and with the community."

BEPS and BEPS OSHC have a RAP Sub-Committee who have been working for the past year on the plan and actions required to show our commitment to reconciliation. This Sub-Committee was also behind the organisation of the fabulous RAP Market we had a few months ago, from which we raised over \$1000!

This is the process that we have been working through:

ESTABLISH A RAP WORKING GROUP

A Working Group ensures the responsibility of implementing reconciliation initiatives does not sit with one person. Your Working Group must include your Principal/Director, and can include teaching and non-teaching staff, parents, students and community members.

COMPLETE THE REFLECTION SURVEY

To assist with planning, the Reflection Survey gives a snapshot of the current state of reconciliation in your school or early learning service.

WRITE A VISION FOR RECONCILIATION

A Vision for Reconciliation clearly communicates your school or early learning service's commitment to reconciliation to the community.

ADD RAP ACTIONS

There are 40 RAP Actions to select from, including 14 that are a minimum requirement. Your Working Group can also set RAP Actionaligned Goals and Deliverables.

SUBMIT THE RAP

RAPs are submitted to the Principal/Director for approval and then to Reconciliation Australia who will review the RAP's Vision for Reconciliation and Acknowledgement of Country statements prior to publication on the 'Who has a RAP' map.

REFRESH THE RAP

12 months after publication, the RAP will be reverted to draft to allow the RAP Working Group to ensure it remains a dynamic, living document. While all data from the previous version of the RAP will be retained, the refresh process involves, at minimum, re-completing the Reflection Survey and re-submitting the RAP.

These are the three sections of actions that the school has written actions for, which are broken into three core areas; relationships, respect and opportunities. The actions are also specific to the classroom, the school and the wider community- this is to ensure that commitment to reconciliation is occurring in a wide-spread manner. t's been a school wide commitment, in which all staff, educators and leadership team have been involved in.

At the end of last week, Narragunnawali endorsed and approved our RAP! This means that we will continue to work through our actions and we will be able to use our RAP funding to further embed histories, cultures and perspectives into our school- which may be professional learning for staff, commissioning artwork, installing plaques, coordinating a Welcome to Country, paying guest speakers, attending events, buying curriculum resources, etc.

Even though our RAP has been approved, it is still an ongoing process. Every 12 months, the RAP will be updated to include new goals and actions for the school and community to work towards. This is important as it ensures that we are continuously committed and working on reconciliation.
